At our core we are a generic co-educational special school for students with an EHCP.

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& OUR ETHOS

Our school strives relentlessly to raise aspirations and attainment by providing high quality teaching and learning in a safe and secure environment in which the pupils' welfare is paramount and where everyone is valued equally.

### THE SCHOOL PROMOTES, ENCOURAGES, SUPPORTS AND CELEBRATES LEARNING BY ENSURING:

We are all citizens and many students explore the wider community through programmes such as the Duke of Edinburgh Award, community volunteering and independent travel training. Students are encouraged to take part in work experience opportunities and for some, this has led to offers of employment once they leave school.

Students may stay in 6th Form for a maximum of 4 years depending on their individual needs. Some students are ready to enter the world of work or college at the end of year 11, for others it might be at the end of year 12, or 13. For a few students, staying for year 14 makes all the difference, especially if they are likely to benefit from day provision with a social care provider rather than a college course.

No matter when students leave, they will have had support and guidance for their transition, including careers advice. Our transition lead also works closely with parents and carers to make the process as smooth as possible. Visits to future placements, such as local colleges and independent social care providers, are organised alongside visits to careers events.





### **CURRICULUM**

In 6th Form (Year 11 onwards), students continue their education whilst being supported in their preparation for adulthood and life beyond Two Rivers. This not only involves academic study, at a level appropriate to the individual, but also vocational and functional courses.



Our commitment to supporting children goes beyond the curriculum and we have many initiatives available...

### **Pastoral support**

Some of our students may need extra support outside of lessons and they can benefit from the personalised support offered. We have a dedicated team of non teaching support staff which consist of a Pupil Support Lead, a support worker and teaching assistants.

### **Therapies**

Our students can access a variety of therapies from our trained staff, these include, individual and group sessions, including, Music, Lego, Drawing and Talking and Counselling.

### Social, Moral, Spiritual and Cultural Development

Students follow PSHE and RE throughout the school, and take part in weekly assemblies

### Health

Nurses and staff work together to ensure the physical well-being of our students. Physiotherapy, occupational therapy and Speech and Language therapy are delivered by our staff.

### Parental Engagement/EHCP & Annual Reviews

Regular contact between the school and the parents regarding all aspects of student development are crucial to provide the best outcomes.

## OUR COMPLEX

For our more complex students we provide an environment which is safe and stimulating enabling students to be confident and engaged in their learning.

The River classes are a mixed cohort from Year 7 to Year 14. The students are selected for these classes based on their social, communication and academic needs. Students in the River classes benefit from an increased staff to student ratio to enable them to access and enjoy a varied and individualised curriculum.

Our specialised and dedicated teachers and support staff provide a nurturing environment to facilitate communication, self-esteem and social awareness. Lessons allow exploration, sensory stimulation, problem solving and independence to enable our students to succeed.

Students use their preferred form of communication including Makaton and PECS and they can access therapies including Rebound, Speech and Language, Physiotherapy, Play and Lego Therapy and Nurture.

Through our curriculum we endeavour to provide our students with a sense of self-worth, responsibility and self-discipline.

### Students learn in mixed year, streamed ability classes.

Year 7 and 8 students follow National curriculum subjects.

Year 9 & 10 students work towards accredited courses in core subjects and some non-core. These accreditations range from AQA Unit Awards, ASDAN and Entry Level Certificates.

Our Sixth Form starts in Year 11 where students take further accredited courses including GCSE's and experience a variety of life skills and careers advice.

Many students have the opportunity to take part in other vocational and creative subjects such as Forest School and some vocational subjects such as Engineering, Dance, Drama and Photography.




Students have the opportunity to learn and develop in many specialist areas within the school. These include:
