We also took part in a Poetry and Sculpture Trail. We loved working out all the clues, and spending time in the fresh air.


Welcome to our latest Two Rivers High School.....Newsletter!

Ariane and Sirius have done some fantastic English work this half term, reading the story Funny Bones and learning how to write their own sequel.


Students even performed in Explorers assembly signing and reading the Funny Bones poems:

We sent a postcard from Flat Stanley, we wrote letters to our families and we wrote a letter to King Charles.


