

We had another two visitors into animal care this week. Our sixth former Lottie showcased her guinea pigs and their behaviours. We all enjoyed having a pet with them, especially cheeky Hay-Hay! Whilst Everest enjoyed a visit from Johnnie who listened to their reading.

Curiosity have been having weekly swimming lessons this half term. It has been amazing to see them enjoying themselves, immersing themselves in the lessons and learning important skills for their safety such as life savings strategies.





Capella and Polaris have been learning about communities and fundraising as part of their SMSC topic and have fundraised for the school by having a stall at the Christmas fayre. They chose their own ideas, made their own creations, designed posters, signs and advertisements and ran the stalls themselves. Polaris chose to make and sell Christmas snow globes while Capella chose to make and sell the opportunity to play Christmas games such as pin the carrot on the snowman. Both classes did an amazing job!

As part of the PSHE curriculum, Venture have been learning about mental health and wellbeing. Classes have worked on identifying their own strengths and also the strengths and positive attributes and qualities of others.
