Lola - My hamster is called Flake and he ate a cake.


Luke N – My cheese has a disease.

Wiktor - The frog is swimming, the dog is digging.





We believe it is essential for our pupils to understand the importance of looking after their mental health and look forward to next term's new learning!









Galaxy have been working on their money skills this term. We have been matching the correct amount to the coin, adding money together and working out what coins we can use to make different amounts.



This term in English, Galaxy have been working on recognising tricky words and being able to identify what a word starts with. Some pupils have also been working really hard on writing their own name.


#### **Next Steps Career Fayre**



Nova visited the National Memorial Arboretum on 9<sup>th</sup> November as part of Nova's Relational Days






The school disco raised an impressive **£206.50** which will be used for trips and visits.
