Uniform Policy

Two Rivers Primary School

It is our policy that all wear school uniform when attending school, representing the school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours.

The aim is that pupils of Two Rivers Primary School will develop and feel a sense of community and belonging through the wearing of the school uniform.

From time to time, some issues of safety and comfort for individual pupils which may necessitate some changes to the normal uniform can be taken into consideration. In the interest of Health and Safety we do not allow pupils to wear jewellery unless this has been agreed by the Senior Leadership Team.

The school asks that the uniform detailed below be followed:

SCHOOL REQUIREMENTS

School uniform is compulsory. It can be purchased from a number of outlets including

Alternatively, you may purchase a **plain** sweatshirt in the correct colour from any high street chain store or supermarket.

Main School

Royal blue sweatshirt/cardigan
White/Royal Blue polo shirt
Black trousers or skirt
Plain black shoes/black trainers



In the summer girls can wear a blue school summer dress

A Royal blue waterproof jacket is available with the school logo on

PE

Black shorts
White t-shirt – available with the school logo
Trainers/pumps

(A kit is provided by school when representing a team)

Swimming

One piece costume or trunks (not shorts)
Towel

During Parents Evening events we will have a rail of second-hand uniform and PE kit available.

At other times the rail can be found in the main reception area and parents may access this at any time.

Forest School

During Forest School lessons students are advised to wear a coat, hat and gloves in the cold weather and a sun hat in the summer. Wellies and waterproof clothing are provided by the school although students can bring their own if preferred.

All articles of clothing should be clearly marked with the child's name. We encourage independence at every stage so children will be learning to put on and take off their own coat, uniform, socks and shoes when getting dressed for different sessions – this can sometimes mean that uniform gets mixed up with other children.
