



Report on Sports Funding 2024/25

The Government has pledged the continuation of Sports Funding for schools as a commitment to provide pupils with an enriching curriculum that inspires more young people to get active, and enjoy the life changing benefits that come from play, sport and physical activity.

The 5 key areas include:

1. Increase staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport.
2. Increase engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport,
3. Raise the profile of PE and sports across the school, to support whole school improvement,
4. Offer broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils,
5. Increase participation in competitive sport.

This year the funding will total: £17,200.

Each year Two Rivers Primary School plan to spend the funding with our priority target in place:

Including demonstrating skills in using different strokes and lifesaving self-rescue.</p> <p>Pupils across our sensory classes were able to access swimming at our primary MAT school Cherry trees where a pool is available. Two pupils attend per session and this has been successful.
