

Pupils have been learning about **Earthquakes and Volcanoes** in Geography, we have learnt about why and how natural disasters

happen and also where they happen in the world. To support this learning pupils worked in groups to make 3D models of volcanoes in Art using Papier Mache, they were then painted. Pupils then enjoyed making the volcanoes erupt, using bicarbonate soda, vinegar and food colouring.

The Middle School Navigation Group have also undertaken a number of visits to Kingsbury Water Park, Rosliston Country Park and the National Memorial Arboretum to complete some orienteering courses. With the support of Miss Webb and Mrs Brough students used pictures to move between different sculptures and features, working together to successfully complete each course.

Students have been learning about the construction industry this term. We have been working alongside **Engie**, visiting their construction sites in the local area and finding out about the processes involved in creating and developing a housing estate.

We toured sites at **Tinkers** Green in Wilnecote and Kerria Rd in Amington, learning about the whole process from groundworks to the final finish on the houses, their driveways and their gardens. **Engie** have agreed to offer **Work Experience** placements for students in Year 11 and above with an interest in the Construction Industry.

<u>Sixth formers</u> in <u>Computing</u> have been using 'Makey Makey' to explore and develop their Programming skills. Pupils designed and made their own game controller using playdough and wired it to play Flappy Bird and Super Mario. They also used bananas for a keyboard to play the piano - that's bananas!
